Established as a not-for-profit rural community hospital in 1965. Operates today as a **Joint Commission-accredited** 25-bed Critical Access Hospital, serving approximately 83,000 residents in Jefferson, northern Lewis and southern St. Lawrence counties.

Operates a network of community-based clinics, including its Family Health Center, Pediatric Clinic and Women's Way to Wellness and provides a range of specialty care, including general surgery, orthopedics, urology, physical therapy and behavioral health.

Innovations and efficiencies in Emergency Department patient care like bedside registration and a "Fast Track" program have led to the shortest average ER patient wait times in the region.

■ Has the only **Obstetrics Unit** in the region with labor, delivery, recovery and postpartum birthing suites that offer women an uninterrupted continuum of care from registration to discharge.

Consistently ranked above average in patient satisfaction surveys.

■ Home to a developing **Orthopedic Center of Excellence** in upper extremity care led by a nationally published and recognized orthopedic surgeon and **Harvard Shoulder Service Fellow**.

• Orthopedics Department director is a member of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons, the American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons Society and the Harvard Codman Shoulder Society.

■ Has the only nationally accredited **Diabetes Education Program** in Jefferson County and one of only two in Northern New York. **Clinical Nutrition Team** includes two **Certified Diabetes Educators** on staff.

Therapy Services team includes a board-certified geriatric care specialist and a board-certified hand therapist.

Expanded patient access to general surgery in 2017 with the addition of two board-certified general surgeons and 24-hour on-call surgical coverage for emergency procedures.

INPATIENT SERVICES

Observation Unit

Patients requiring additional monitoring to determine if admission if necessary can be cared for in the Observation Unit.

Acute Care Services

With the availability of our many on-site diagnostic testing and therapy services, the Acute Care unit consists of 24 beds. Care is provided by a team of medical professionals, including a Hospitalist.

Swing Bed Services

Providing patients an opportunity for in-hospital care when a longer recuperation time is necessary. This may be necessary following an acute illness or surgical procedure. Patients are accepted from other facilities who meet criteria for sub-acute rehabilitation.

OUTPATIENT SERVICES

Ambulatory Surgical Care

The Ambulatory Surgery Unit at River Hospital offers our communities the option of having a minor surgical procedures performed close to home and delivered with special care. Our services include: Breast Health; Colorectal; Ear, Nose & Throat; Endoscopy; Gynecology; General Surgery; Ophthalmology and Vein Procedures.

Cardiopulmonary Services

Licensed Respiratory Therapists on staff to provide both routine and emergency inpatient and outpatient services for pediatrics through adults. Services include: Ambulatory/Nocturnal Pulse Oximetry; Respiratory Medication Administration and Teaching; Diagnostic Testing for both heart and lungs including EKG's, Holter Monitors, and Pulmonary Function Tests.

Our services include treatment for: Osteoporosis; Headaches & Chronic Pain; Vertigo; Phase III & IV Cardiac Rehabilitation and Pre & Post-Orthopedic Surgery.

Radiology Services

Providing a variety of routine procedures by appointment and emergency procedures 24 hours per day. Fully qualified Radiologist on staff. Mammography and Stereotactic Breast Biopsy capabilities to aid in the early detection and treatment of breast cancer. American College of Radiology Accredited. Services include: Digital Mammography; Emergency & Routine X-Ray; CT Scan; Ultrasound and Bone Densitometry.

River Community Wellness Program

River Community Wellness Program (RCWP) provides intensive outpatient treatment to Ft. Drum soldiers who are suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. RCWP also serves the mental health needs of the local community, as well as Veterans. RCWP will help to fill a growing need for the civilian and military communities alike.
